RECEPTION & YEAR ONE- MISS LUESLEY

Wow! Ash class have certainly been working incredibly hard over the past months. We have thoroughly enjoyed our science and geography enquiries where we have learnt all about the seasons, weather patterns and even made our own rain gauges. We have moved on to learn about living and non-living things. We have begun focusing on living plants and we have established what something needs to be living and have been able to differentiate between old and young plants. In our recent Geography enquiry, Ash class compared life in a village against life in a city. We took a closer look at Bristol city, where we explored the streets using Google Earth. We compared our village school against a much larger school in Bristol called Bristol Cathedral School. We spent lots of time looking at the school's virtual tour and established that the classrooms were a similar size but with lots more chairs and the school had much less green spaces compared to our school. In Literacy, Ash class have been exploring different ways to start their stories. We have been including adjectives in our writing and have started our writing with, once upon a time, In a land far away, In the deep dark wood, One day and many more. Year 1 have been working very hard to read back through their work to edit their writing and Reception have been challenging themselves to write a minimum of three sentences. Ash Class writing is looking amazing!! Well done!! In Maths, Reception have been sharing quantities equally and investigating doubles to 10. Year 1 have just started multiplication and division, where we have begun by focusing on doubles to 20. Year 1 have been using counters to show their multiplication arrays.

OAK CLASS

YEAR 2 & 3- MRS HENNING AND MRS STANILAND

It has certainly already been a busy start to the last half term before the summer break!

Oak class have been busy embracing all their new learning and enjoying visitors that have come to the school. We were lucky to have a representative from the Houses of Parliament talk to the class about how Parliament works and used this as an opportunity to talk about how the children vote and have a say in ideas for the school. Rev Jim has also entertained us with his very hands-on Collective Worship's each week looking at leadership this term. The children took part in a 'baking cake' assembly using leadership values as ingredients i.e. communicator, tolerance to add to the cake mixture. The children found this great found and really brought their learning to life. We have also had a visit from two musicians who play the cello, flute and piano and the children had a lovely workshop exploring the cello as an instrument. Lastly, although the wet weather cancelled the cricket in Crewkerne, we were lucky to have a coach visit the school and teach the children some cricket skills.

In class, we finished our learning journey about habitats before the half term break. The children were learning to look like a scientist, and each child produced a water-colour painting of their insect and wrote a description about it. These have been made into mini spotters guides for our local area to share with the rest of the school. Our new geography learning enquiry is about looking at Buckland St Mary on a map and contrasting this to Wandsworth in London. The children have used OS maps and compasses and found out what all the symbols on a map mean. In Spanish, they continue to learn greetings and numbers and are now learning about the Spanish words for parts of the body by singing Heads, shoulders, knees and toes in Spanish – great fun.

Maths continues with the year 2's now recapping and consolidating all their learning they have done this year and the year 3's have learned about adding and taking away fractions and they have begun to look at telling the time.

First of all, a huge well done to all of our Year 6's who worked so hard in their SATs this term! We are all proud of your effort and hard work! The end of SATs week was marked with a SATs party, which was a lovely reward for the effort and perseverance you showed throughout.

In Beech class we have all been enjoying our latest enquiry question 'How can I make a sculpture inspired by an illustration?' A huge thank you to FOBs for giving us the money to buy clay and other materials for our sculptures, we have thoroughly enjoyed creating our mixed-up animal creatures based on the story 'The Barnabus Project.' We are now using these creations as our inspiration for a short adventure story, using exciting and ambitious vocabulary!

In Maths, Year 6 worked incredibly hard to prepare for SATs, and have shown a great maturity in their learning. We will now consolidate that learning through some `moving on' activities, designed to help them prepare for their new journey in secondary school.

The Year 5s have been focusing on calculating fractions, learning how to create a common denominator in order to add or subtract a fraction accurately. Luckily, they are superstars at multiplication, so have taken it all in their stride! Year 4 have been practicing hard for their Multiplication checks, well done for all of

your hard work, keep practicing!
